 - Info on 5 of 10 priorities on our 2011 list

- Number: IL HB 5825 Updated (Status 12/07/2012)
- o Sponsor: Linda Chapa LaVia
- o Title: SCH CD-HOME HOSPITAL GRANTS
- Abstract: Amends the School Code to provide that, except for those children qualifying under the Article of the Code concerning children with disabilities, school districts shall be eligible to receive reimbursement for all children requiring home or hospital instruction at not more than \$1,000 annually per child or \$9,000 (instead of \$8,000) per teacher, whichever is less.
- o Status: <u>House Sent to the Governor 12/06/2012</u>

- o Sponsor: Roger Kahn
- Title: Retirement; public school employees; deadline to elect pension contribution limits; extend. Amends secs. 8, 59, 84b & 91a of 1980 PA 300
- Abstract: To amend 1980 PA 300, entitled "The public school employees retirement act of 1979," by amending sections 8, 59, 84b, and 91a (MCL 38.1308, 38.1359, 38.1384b, and 38.1391a), section 8 as amended and sections 59, 84b, and 91a as added by 2012 PA 300.






NO SILVER BULLET


- ${\color{blue} \circ}$ CQ StateTrack is a tool, not a solution
- o Reports will need careful, informed review
 - All tools from 2012 will still apply
- Second phase of project will include "write your legislator" functionality
 - $\bullet\,$ Expect to see that in the next fiscal year for 2014 session
 - Would change our pp-alerts and add tracking on how many members actually take action.
 - $\bullet\,$ What do we need to do in 2013 to be ready for that?

















WHAT CHANGES ON OUR TWO E-MAIL LISTS

- o pp-info general information on many issues
 - Will get email from new CQ StateTrack system
 - May receive some notices from branch PP chairs
 - Any member may subscribe without requirement to be a "sender" if they want to get all information.
- o pp-alerts specific information needed to contact legislators on priority issues
 - · Messages will be brief and to the point
 - Leadership team will be responsible for deciding who posts on what
