The **Educational Opportunity Fund** is the area of the new AAUW Funds that is most closely aligned with the former “AAUW Educational Foundation”. It houses the endowment funds that honor AAUW leaders, specific branches, and other priorities of the members. This year, the national organization made a concerted effort to have members designate contributions to funds that had not reached stipend-producing level, whether or not members had a personal connection to the honoree of the fund. We are pleased to announce that through this national effort the **Charlotte Branch Research and Projects Fund** has reached its goal of \$30,000 and will begin to support Community Action Grants and Career Development Grants for 2013-2014. The **Ann Chipley American Fellowship**, started by the national board, not AAUW NC, in honor of a member of the national staff who had been deeply involved as a volunteer in North Carolina, also grew significantly, but it has not reached stipend-producing level as of 12/31/2012. Given the large number of funds to which members contributed, we’ll not try to break this report out by branch, but here are the state totals to the various funds:
