In 2016, AAUW NC was pleased to see the completion of the Ann Chipley American Fellowship (honoring a former AAUW NC president who was a key AAUW staff member at the time of her death). For 2017-2018 the fellowship income is supporting Asst. Prof. Angela Gist at the University of Kansas with a publication grant for her project exploring gender and social class bias among hiring managers.

Most (\$5,189) of the \$6,154 donated to EOF was unrestricted, but \$915 was contributed to the Chipley endowment, and \$50 was donated to support American Fellowships, specifically.
